Old Business</b></p> <p>1) <a href="#">Accessible Events Guide</a></p> <p>i. Accessible Events Guide was reviewed externally by two members of the public.</p> <p>ii. City of Edmonton Communications completed an overall edit of the documents.</p> <p>iii. Staff in the City of Edmonton Communications, Events, Civic Precinct and Public Engagement provided a review and comments.</p> <p>iv. This guide was intended for City staff, but the AAC would be happy to share with anyone who would like to use it.</p> <p>2) <a href="#">Bus Network Redesign</a></p> <p>i. The Bus Network Redesign was launched on April 25, 2021 to improve the transit system by providing more direct routes for Edmontonians.</p> <p>ii. There are five new types of routes: frequent, rapid, crosstown, local and community.</p> <p>iii. City reallocated routes with low ridership to areas who had no little to no service before (37 communities). For the routes that service was removed, citizens are able to access the On-Demand pilot that will take riders to the nearest transit hub. Riders would be asked to be able to walk up to 400 m for an On-Demand trip.</p> <p>iv. Some concerns that have been shared:</p> <p>a. Decreased bus service in some areas</p> <p>b. Having to walk further to a bus stop</p> <p>c. No bus service</p> <p>d. Some areas do not have on demand</p> <p>e. Added travel time</p> <p>f. What will happen in the winter?</p> <p>g. On the On-Demand - are there auditory cues?</p>	<p>Connect with ETSAB and invite members</p>

How Edmontonians can provide feedback on concerts: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. 311</li> <li>b. Feedback <a href="#">survey</a></li> </ul> </li> <li>vii. A report will be going towards Council after the election, tentatively in the fourth quarter in 2021.</li> <li>viii. The Bus Network Redesign will not make substantial changes in 2021 as they do not want to overreact to concerns. However, if there are clear issues, they will be addressed with good data to back up why to make the changes. Data is skewed right now, due to COVID and lowered service.</li> <li>ix. Reschedule C. Hotton-MacDonald to a main AAC meeting</li> </ul> <p>3) <a href="#">Escooters</a></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. Escooters first came to Edmonton three years ago. There are currently three companies: Lime, Bird and Spin. Lime shared that they did 500,000 trips in 2020.</li> <li>ii. There are many concerns that have been heard anecdotically, from Councillors and on Social Media: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Improper use</li> <li>b. People almost being run over/hit</li> <li>c. Parking or leaving Escooters in random places</li> </ul> </li> <li>iii. COE has taken a hands off approach in enforcement.</li> <li>iv. The Insight community completed a survey in 2020: <a href="#">City E-Scooter Survey 2020</a>.</li> <li>v. Consider promotion of more bike lanes, to allow for more space for people who are biking, scooting, walking and/or using a wheelchair.</li> </ul>	<p>to an AAC meeting.</p> <p>Create a hypothetical survey (in advance of winter) - how could the Bus Network Redesign affect you in the future?</p> <p>Move Escooters to Policy subcommittee to talk about enforcement/education campaigns with Escooter companies.</p>
